I have forty plus years of experience in secondary education, including holding senior posts such as deputy headships and headship until 1989. I served Cambridgeshire Local Education Authority as an Education Office, Maths Adviser and TVEI consortium coordinator from 1989 to 2000.

I became an Independent Education Consultant from 2000 to 2003 working with many Local Authorities. I undertook Ofsted inspections for a range of National companies. In 2011 the Director of Education for the Diocese of Ely invited me to become the Chair of the Temporary Governing Body for the Pathfinder CEVA Primary school, Northstowe. Subsequently in 2016 I was invited to become a Trustee of DEMAT and I serve on their Standards and Ethos committee. I have lead on the small and rural school investigation for DEMAT.
